Mikey —

Fair enough. I'll characterize your statements according to what you actually said.

What you actually said was that my/Borough "questionable changes and minor refinements have been monitored for years." You did not simply say that publicly accessible webpages can be monitored for changes. You characterized the changes as "questionable," which plainly added an insinuation about the nature of those changes.

Your latest explanation—that your point was "simply that changes to previously published Borough webpage content can be detected and documented over time"—is considerably more neutral than what you actually wrote.

So yes, I agree with your broader point: statements and records should be characterized according to what they actually say and establish, rather than extending proposition A into unsupported propositions B and C. But that standard needs to work both ways, and subsequent explanations shouldn't remove qualifying—or insinuating—language from what was originally written.

Websites evolve. Content gets updated, corrected, clarified, reorganized, and refined. If you believe a particular Borough website change was improper, identify the specific change and explain why. Otherwise, describing unspecified changes as "questionable" doesn't establish anything.

To keep the record precise, your characterization is broader than what I stated.

My reference to changes being "monitored" was specifically to automated change detection on publicly accessible Borough webpages, which provides notice when content on those webpages changes. I did not state that I monitor the Borough's "public information" generally.

That statement was also not an answer to, and should not be construed as an answer to, your questions concerning RTK Corpus, MIKE OS, their architecture, data sources, inputs, testing, training, or their use in any particular RTKL matter. I have not provided you with that information.

As to your follow-up, I do not dispute the obvious proposition that municipal websites are updated. My point was simply that changes to previously published Borough webpage content can be detected and documented over time.

Please characterize my statements according to what I actually said rather than extending them beyond their stated scope.
